A Guide to the Evening Service

A Service of Installation

As part of our corporate worship this Lord's Day evening, it is our privilege to host the Commission of the Presbytery of the Mississippi Valley for the purpose of installing our new Senior Minister, the Reverend Mr. David T. A. Strain. David was born in Glasgow, Scotland, and came to faith in Christ during his high school years. He studied fine art at Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art in Dundee, Scotland, where he graduated with honors and met his wife, Sheena. While in art school, David was involved in student ministry, and there began to discern a call to the ministry. After graduation, he worked for two years with the Universities and Colleges Christian Fellowship (UCCF, the British version of InterVarsity) at first in Dundee and then in Glasgow. He subsequently came under care of the Glasgow Presbytery of the Church of Scotland and studied theology at Trinity College (Glasgow University).

Because of his biblical convictions, he was prevented from ministering in the Church of Scotland and so attended the Free Church of Scotland College in Edinburgh, graduating with distinction. He was ordained to the gospel ministry in the Free Church in September 2003, and took pastoral charge of Cole Abbey Presbyterian Church, (now London City Presbyterian Church), the Free Church of Scotland congregation in the City of London, England. In 2008, David and his family moved to the United States where he became the Senior Pastor of Main Street Presbyterian Church in Columbus, Mississippi. David has been serving as Minister of Teaching and Mission at First Presbyterian Church Jackson since May 2013.

David and Sheena have been married for 15 years and have two boys Euan, 12, and Joel, 9.

A Guide to the Morning Service

The Scripture Reading

II Peter 1:1–11 – Epistolary opening

Following the usual salutation, Peter dispenses with the conventional thanksgiving and instead exhorts his readers to godly living. He first reminds his readers that Christ has given them everything they need to live godly lives. Using the formula "For this very reason" as his transition, Peter then commands and lists the actions that should characterize those who have received "all things that pertain to life and godliness," as he had said in verse 3. Exalted words tumble out of Peter's imagination and spill onto the page with splendor and exuberance. (Literary Study Bible, Crossway)

The Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs

Exalt the Lord, His Praise Proclaim

We begin with a lively setting of a text of part of Psalm 135 to a tune from Haydn's Creation (a metrical arrangement of "The Heavens are Telling"). The psalm exhorts us to praise God because of His name, His goodness, His covenant blessings, His sovereignty, and His providence. A stirring hymn of praise to open our Lord's Day Morning public worship together!

The Doxology

In response to our prayer of adoration and confession, we sing this marvelous and familiar stanza of praise. It is a call for everyone in heaven and earth to praise the Triune God who is the giver of all blessings. In fact, this stanza that is commonly referred to as "The Doxology" is merely the last stanza of each of three hymns composed by the fine evangelical Bishop Thomas Ken in 1674. Today, we sing this hymn of praise to the glorious and well-known tune "Old One Hundredth."

Now Thank We All Our God

In response to our Morning Prayer, we sing this great hymn written by Martin Rinkart (1586-1649), a Lutheran minister. Rinkhart wrote this hymn for a grand celebration service at the end of the Thirty Years' War. During that era, there was a tremendous strain on the pastors who had to conduct dozens of funerals daily. Finally, Rinkart was the only one left—doing 50 funerals a day. It is a testament to his faith that, after such misery, he was able to write a hymn of abiding trust and gratitude toward God. May the Lord grant us the grace to sing this hymn with trust and gratitude toward Him, in any sort of circumstances.

Sing Praise to the Lord!

Having heard God's Word in the letter to the Philippians read and proclaimed, we respond by singing this fine hymn, which is actually a paraphrase of Psalm 150. The 150th Psalm is the conclusion to the whole Psalter, and its first verse exhorts God's people to, "Praise the LORD. Praise God in his sanctuary; praise Him in his mighty heavens!" This triumphant psalm is a fitting conclusion to the "Hymnbook of the Old Testament", and a fitting conclusion to our Lord's Day Morning Worship as well! Indeed, as the hymn exclaims, "for love in creation, for heaven restored, for grace of salvation," let us sing praise to our Lord!
