#### I Kings

#### Key Word: Division

Name of 1 and 2 Kings taken from kings whose deeds it narrates. First Kings opens with Israel in her glory as most powerful kingdom in the world and closes with her divided and her glory gone.

<u>Note:</u> From time of division, Israel never returns to worship of Jehovah. Judah never completely turns away from the worship of Jehovah, but never completely rids herself of idolatry, although at times we witness great periods of revival, namely under Asa (1 Kings 15), Joash (2 Kings 11), Josiah (2 Kings 22).

- I. Reign of Solomon chapters 1-11
  - 1. Decline of David 1:1-4
  - 2. Adonijah's plot defeated and Solomon made king 1:5-53
  - 3. Solomon becomes king 2:1-46
    - a. David's charge to Solomon and his death 1-12
    - b. Solomon clears his kingdom of unfaithful followers 13-46
      - i. Adonijah; Abiather; Joab; Shemei
  - 4. Solomon chooses wisdom (note vs. 9) and demonstration of it in judging between two mothers chapter 3
  - 5. Solomon organizes his kingdom chapter 4
    - a. Notice what Samuel said in 1 Samuel 8:7-18
  - 6. Solomon builds the temple chapters 5-8 (note magnificence of it all)
  - 7. Solomon's greatness and wealth chapters 9-10
    - a. Queen of Sheba visits him chapter 10
  - 8. Solomon's sin and death chapter 11
    - a. Brought horses from Egypt (10:28-29) and multiplied wives to himself (11:1) in violation of God's command in Deuteronomy 17:14-20
    - b. But God did not take Solomon away from being king because of promise to David in 2 Samuel 7:15
- II. Divisions of Kingdom into Judah and Israel chapters 12-16
  - 1. Accession of Rehoboam and his folly 12:1-15
  - 2. Jeroboam's revolt kingdom divided 12:16-24
  - 3. Worship of Jehovah permanently put away in Israel and idolatry established 12:25-33

<u>Note:</u> From now through remainder of 1 Kings and to 2 Kings 17, when Israel carried captive, we have parallel account of two kingdoms.

  - a. Jezebel had introduced worship of Baal into Israel 16:31-33
- 3. God's care of His servant chapter 19
