- 1. I feel so unworthy to try and preach this morning.
- 2. We all have so many needs.
 - a. Some sick
 - b. Some have loved ones sick
 - c. Some have sorrow in their heart
 - d. Some have family difficulties
 - e. Some have financial difficulties
 - 1. Debts
 - 2. Business to finance
 - 3. Family to care for
 - f. Some have sense of great sinfulness
 - 1. Break heart
 - 2. Not love God as should
 - 3. Not have faith we should have
 - 4. Outward sins
 - g. War clouds hanging heavy
 - 1. Increased responsibility
 - 2. Children leave home
- 3. Oh how I would love to help.
- 4. Only way I know is to try and point you to Christ.
 - a. But I realize I can tell you things about Christ, but they will mean something to you only as the Holy Spirit makes those truths effective to you.
- 5. The elements of communion speak to us of Christ.
 - a. Let me call your attention to what they mean to us.
- I. They show the broken mutilated body of the Son of God
 - 1. Who He is
 - a. Pre-existent Son of God
 - 1. "From all ages"
 - b. Creator of all things
 - c. Glory with Father before foundation of the world
 - 2. Yet He hung upon a cross
 - a. Body already abused
 - 1. Back
 - 2. Brow
 - b. Nailed to a cross

- 1. Bones out of joint
- c. Heart broken
 - 1. Literally broken
- 3. He died

II. Why we come to this table this morning

- 1. He commanded us to do so
 - a. It is His wish
 - b. Should find joy in doing this thing He wants done
- 2. In remembrance of Him
 - a. He desires to be remembered
 - 1. So many forget Him
 - b. Once each three months we are called to this service
 - 1. Seeing elements may remember Him
- 3. Our minds should be filled with floodtide of memories of Him
 - a. See in our minds
 - 1. His suffering
- 4. Because of some things will do for us

III. Increase our faith

- 1. In these days much to test our faith
 - a. Most of us face hardships of one kind or another
 - b. Sickness comes to us
 - c. See our own lives and realize our own failures
 - d. See world
 - 1. Turned away from Him
 - 2. War seems so eminent
- 2. This communion table should increase our faith
 - a. God planned this before foundation of world
 - b. He foretold would send Christ
 - 1. Where born
 - 2. How born
 - 3. How die
 - c. Shows great love
 - 1. Surely many things out of life may cast serious doubt in our minds about the love of God
 - 2. But this should be pross
- 3. Then as we gather around this table should have a greater faith in God and Christ

IV. Should beget peace of conscience

- 1. Conscience in a mysterious, marvelous thing
 - a. Its function is to prompt us when do wrong
 - b. Lead to consciousness of our sin
- 2. Before this table should be very conscious of our sins
 - a. Should be most disturbing to us
- 3. Come now to confess them before God

- 4. Be sure of His forgiveness
- 5. May not understand
 - a. But lay sins at Jesus' feet
 - 1. Great hymn, "Just As I Am" #174)
- 6. This communion table is assurance of our forgiveness

V. To support under troubles

- 1. Trouble are not easily borne
- 2. Would be easy to be crushed by them
- 3. I can only point you to cross
 - a. Christ loves you
 - b. He will care for you
- 4. He desires to put arms around you and protect
 - a. Not from troubles
 - b. But from let troubles crush
 - c. "How Firm a Foundation" (#205)

VI. To encourage and quicken in duty

- 1. See Christ being obedient in duty
- 2. Page 84 "These Prophetic Voices" Some time ago in London, a man who was spending most of his time ministering to the suffering with no relief from those distressing tasks was asked by a friend, "Why don't you run away from it all before you are broken by this in human burden?" And the man replied, "I would like to run away I would like to run away from it all, but a strange man on a cross won't let me."

VII. To inspire with love and zeal

- 1. Surely should love Him
 - a. A father wrote a son at one time and said, "I do not suppose if I had a million dollars I could buy your affection" and of course the father was correct.
 - b. Affection cannot be bought
- 2. But surely such a love as God's should beget love

VIII. Beget a hope of eternal life

- 1. See Christ's dead body, broken, blood shed
- 2. He arose "Till I come again"
- 3. He died to save
- 4. We shall eat with Him in heaven
