

THIS WEEK'S FOCUS:

Question 70: What is the seventh commandment?

Answer: The seventh commandment is: You shall not commit adultery.

Scripture: Leviticus 20:10-20; 1 Peter 1:13-16; 1 Thessalonians 4:3

Key Thought: The 7th commandment is based on the holiness of God.
