A Guide to the Morning Service

The Psalm, Hymn, and Spiritual Songs

Good Christian Men, Rejoice

Today, we will sing this favorite Christmas song. The words of this Medieval Latin and German carol are variously attributed to Heinrich Suso (died 1366), Peter of Dresden (died 1440) and Valentin Triller (circa 1573). It was translated from Latin-German admixture to English by John Mason Neale and first appeared in his Carols for Christmastide (published in London, England, 1853). It was a great favorite in Germany until comparatively recent times.

It seems likely that the carol dates from "the time in the late 14th century when the creeping of the vernacular into sacred song was first noted. This practice aided the early reformers in introducing congregational singing in the vernacular into their services of worship. Luther, it will be remembered, violated it with all German rules of word order in joining German words to tunes with which the people were familiar." John Mason Neale, the translator, caught the inspiration of the original text and transformed it into something suitable to English sentiment. The continued popularity of the carol is undoubtedly due in part to the swinging 14th century German melody to which it is set.
