THIS WEEK'S FOCUS:

Question 84: What doth every sin deserve?

Answer: Every sin deserveth God's wrath and curse, both in this life, and that which is to come.

MONDAY

Scripture: Luke 6:41-43; James 2:8-11

Key Thought: Every sin separates man from God.

Questions:

- Why does this question follow the previous one in the Catechism?
- Why do we tend to minimize our sins by comparing them to others?What does the Bible teach us about so-called "small" sins?
