A GUIDE TO THE MORNING SERVICE

Why do we read the Psalter?

The Psalms are the hymns and prayers of the people of God. They are God's revealed pattern for worship, communion, praise, and prayer. One of the ways to worship God in Spirit and truth is by using the language of Scripture. Since it is the very Word of God, God Himself is speaking to us as we read it, teaching us, revealing Himself to us, even as we are speaking the words of Scripture to Him.

Secondly, in reading a psalm responsively, we are also stressing the communal nature of biblical worship. As we are gather together as God's covenant people singing hymns, reciting creeds, and corporately confessing our sins, a responsive reading unites us together in prayer and praise to our living God.

Finally, the Psalms are wonderfully varied in that they praise various attributes of God from a range of emotional responses. For example, they touch an entire range of practical theology and emotional experiences, like dealing with struggles, understanding God's providence, His work in human history, His ultimate judgment, His goodness, grace, mercy, salvation, and justice. They also teach us to lament and to mourn over our sin, and to rejoice in the goodness of God while living a life of continual praise as we live this life as exiles together.

Psalm 111 is an individual hymn of Thanksgiving. It is an acrostic poem consisting of twenty-two phrases, each of which begins with a successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet. The singer, who is unknown, gives thanks to God for His goodness in delivering him/her from various life-threatening situations such as illness, oppressions, or enemy attacks. As Spurgeon reminds us, "The sweet singer dwells upon the one idea that God should be known by His people, and that this knowledge, when turned into practical piety, is man's true wisdom, and the certain cause of lasting adoration. Many are ignorant of what their Creator has done, and hence they are foolish in heart and silent as to the praises of God: this evil can only be removed by a remembrance of God's works, and a diligent study of them; to this, therefore, the psalm is meant to arouse us. It may be called 'The Psalm of God's Works,' intended to excite us to the work of praise."

THIS WEEK'S FOCUS:

Question 37: What benefits do believers receive from Christ when they die? **Answer:** When believers die, their souls are made perfectly holy, and immediately pass into glory. Their bodies, which are still united to Christ, rest in the grave until the resurrection.
