

She was once a tenured professor of English who identified as a lesbian and worked to advance the cause of LGBT equality. After her conversion to Christ in 1999, she came to see the sinfulness of having any identity apart from Him. Rosaria is married to Kent Butterfield, pastor of the First Reformed Presbyterian Church of Durham, and is a home-school mother, pastor's wife, author, and speaker. She is helping Christians to better

understand their LGBT neighbors and loved ones so that we can lovingly look past labels of sexual identity and share the gospel effectively. In 2012, she published her conversion memoir, The Secret Thoughts of an Unlikely Convert: An English Professor's Journey to Christian Faith. Her second book, Openness Unhindered: Further Thoughts of an Unlikely Convert on Sexual Identity and Union with Christ was published in 2015. She writes about sexuality, identity, Christian community, and seeks to encourage all in faithful Christian living and service.

THIS WEEK'S FOCUS:

Question 35: What is sanctification?

Answer: Sanctification is the work of God's free grace by which our whole person is made new in the image of God, and we are made more and more able to become dead to sin and alive to righteousness.

MONDAY

Scripture: Read John 17:13-19

Key Thought: Sanctification is a work of God's free grace. **Questions:**

- What does it mean that sanctification is a "work" rather than an "act"?
- How did Jesus pray that God would sanctify His disciples?
- How does God use His Word to sanctify us?

Prayer

TUESDAY

Scripture: Read 1 Thessalonians 5:14-24 *Key Thought:* In sanctification we are renewed in the whole man. **Questions:**

- Is there any part of the life of a believer that should not be set apart to God? What parts of your life do you tend to regard as "unspiritual?" How should these be sanctified to God?
- Is moral virtue the same as sanctification? Why or why not?
- Is sanctification primarily a change of behavior or a change of heart? **Prayer**

WEDNESDAY

Scripture: Read Colossians 3:1-17

Key Thought: In sanctification we are renewed after the image of God. **Questions:**

- How was the image of God in man affected by his fall into sin?
- What are the "old man" and the "new man" in verses 9-10?
- How is the image of God in man affected by sanctification?
- According to verses 12-17, what attributes of God are to be reflected in the lives of His children? Are they reflected in your life?

THURSDAY

Scripture: Read Romans 6:1-11; Luke 9:23-26

Key Thought: Through sanctification we die more and more unto sin. **Questions:**

• In what way does Christ make us alive? In what way does He make us dead?

- What does it mean to die more and more unto sin?
- How are dying to sin and dying to self related?

Prayer

FRIDAY

Scripture: Read Ephesians 4:17-32

Key Thought: Through sanctification we live more and more unto righteousness. **Questions:**

- If we "put off" the old man, what must be "put on" in his place?
- In verses 25-32, how does Paul show the way that sanctification replaces sin with righteousness?
- What does it mean to "grieve the Holy Spirit"?

Prayer
