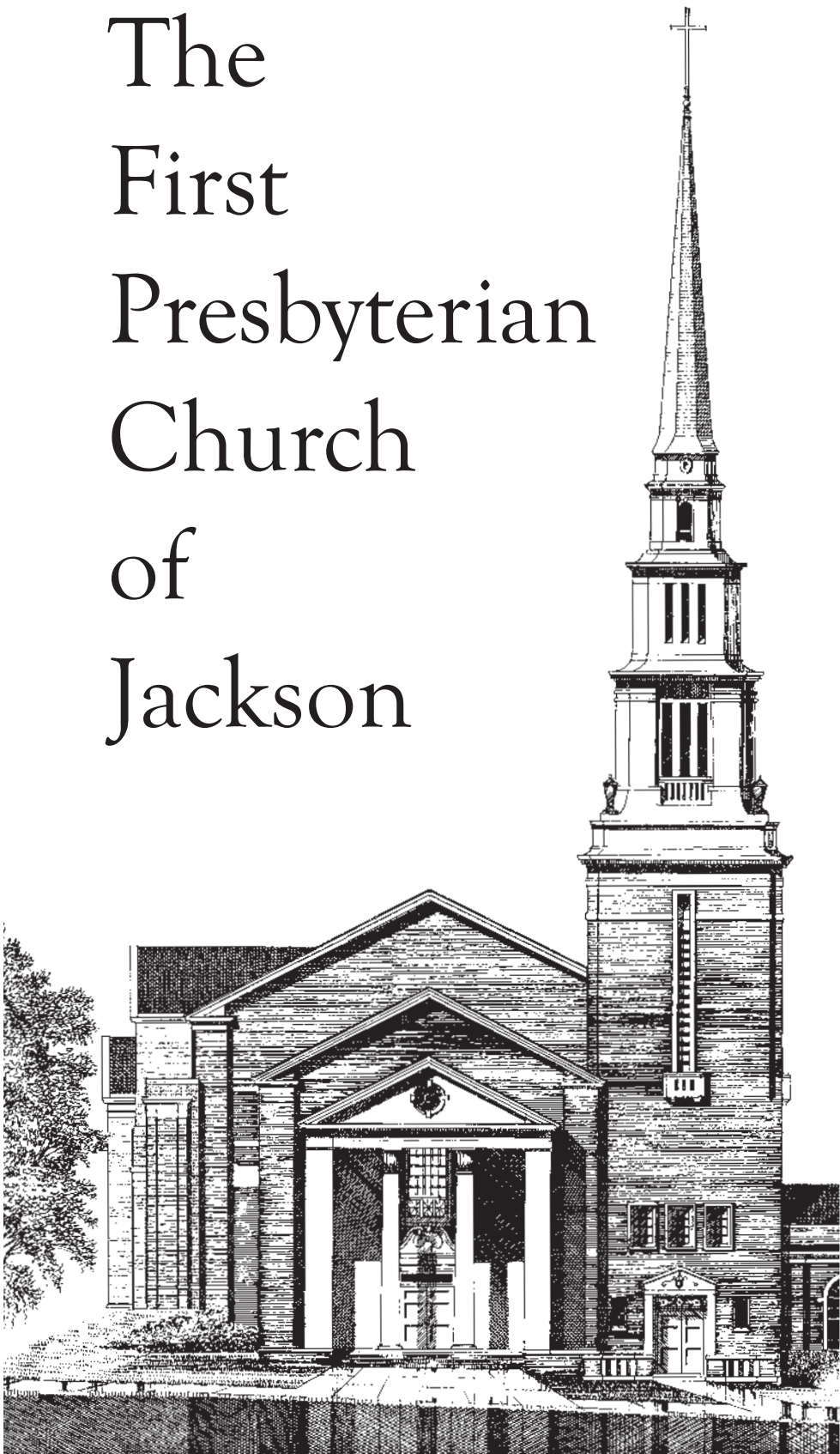

## THIS WEEK'S FOCUS:

### **Question 58: What does the fourth commandment require?**

**Answer:** The fourth commandment requires us to set apart to God the times He has established in His word-- specifically one whole day out of every seven as holy Sabbath to Him.
