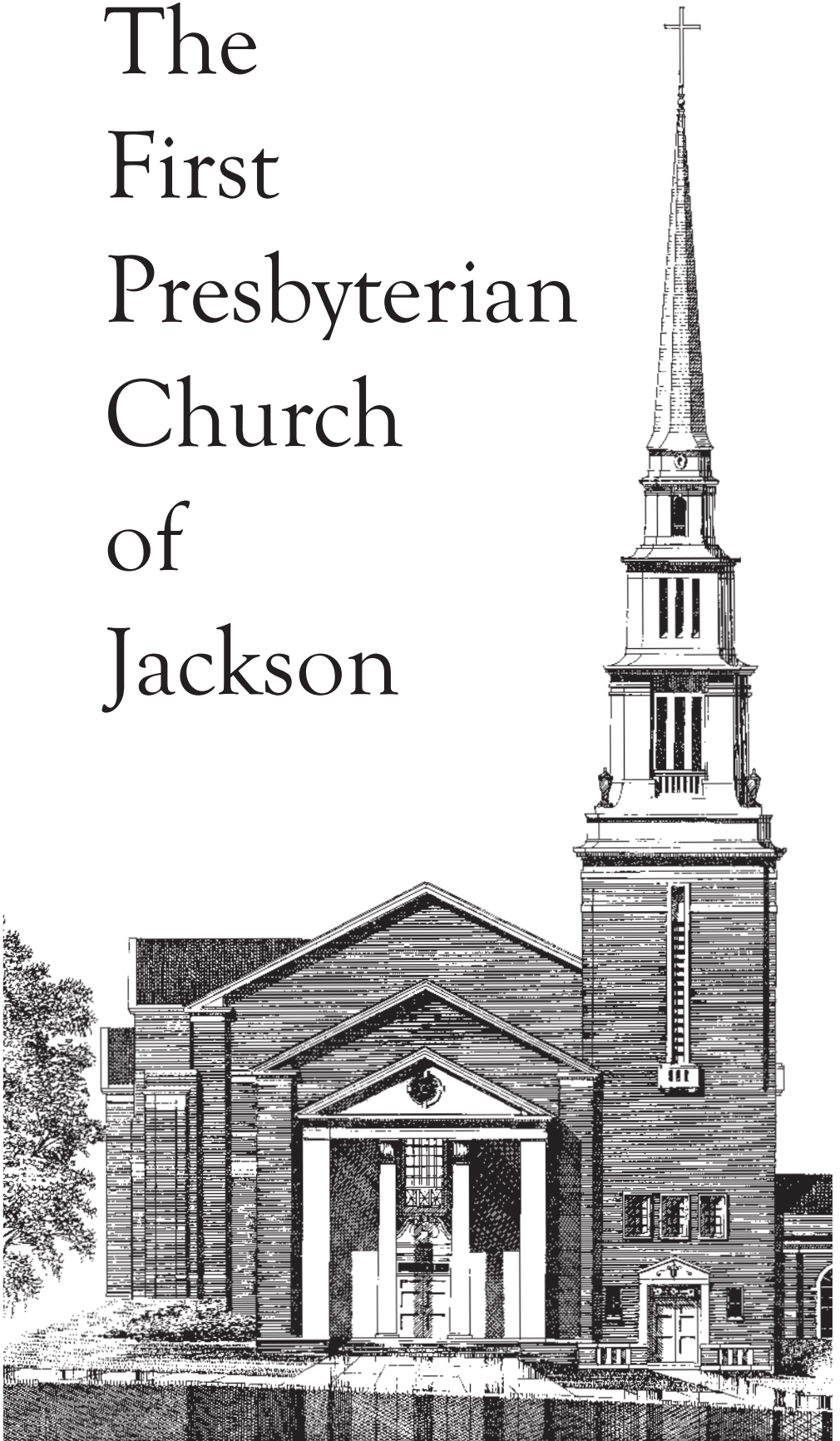

Guest Minister

Originally from Bluefield, Virginia, Michael Campbell graduated from King College in Bristol, Tennessee. In college, he met Keren, who is originally from the Caribbean island of Saint Vincent. They were married in 1987.

After earning a Master of Divinity degree from Covenant Theological Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, the Campbells moved to Miami, Florida, where Mike worked for five years with Ministries in Action, a non-denominational mission agency focused on the Caribbean Islands and Latin America. In 1997 Mike became the pastor of Pinelands Presbyterian Church, a multi-ethnic church, serving there for seven years.

In 2004, Mike, with Keren and their three children, moved to Jackson where he assumed the role of organizing pastor and then senior pastor of Redeemer Church. He received his Doctor of Ministry from Covenant Theological Seminary in May 2014, the emphasis of his study being on the church and the city. Mike has a passion for impacting all people with the truths of the Reformed faith and the life changing power of the gospel.
