## A GUIDE TO THE MORNING SERVICE

## Guest Minister, Dan Iverson

Dan and his wife, Carol, have served as PCA Mission to the World (MTW) church-planting missionaries in the Tokyo/Chiba area of Japan since 1986. The Iversons have 9 children and 19 grandchildren. Japan is the world's second-largest unreached people group, rich in material possessions, education, and technology, but desperately "poor" in terms of the Gospel. Dan has three main roles: Country Director for MTW's six Japan teams, as team leader for the Tokyo/Chiba Church planting team, and lead pastor for an MTW team-planted Japanese church. Carol serves as principal and English-track high school teacher for the bi-lingual hybrid Christian school started by the team.

The vision and goal for MTW Japan is a Biblical, indigenous church-planting movement throughout Japan and the world. This basically means evangelizing and making disciples (Matt 28:19-20) and gathering the people into healthy, Biblical (specifically Presbyterian), grace-based churches with Japanese leadership that continue the same mission.
