A GUIDE TO THE MORNING SERVICE

The Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs

Praise to the Lord, The Almighty

This Lord's Day morning we begin our time of singing with this great psalm paraphrase. The song's author was Joachim Neander, who wrote this hymn when he was 20. "Praise to the Lord" is the opening phrase of each stanza of this song that draws on Psalms 103 and 150. It was translated by the remarkable Catherine Winkworth of whom it has been said that she, more than any other single person, helped bring the German chorale tradition to the English-speaking world. It is a hymn full of devotion and adoration to God and encouragement and comfort to one another. We sing praise to Him for His sovereign control over all things—"who o'er all things so wondrously reigneth"—and draw comfort that because He is in control, He "shelters [us] under His wings." We sing God's praises for His kind providences—"Hast thou not seen how thy desires ever have been granted in what He ordaineth"—and even for the dark providences of life. For surely we know it to be true when we sing, "How oft in grief hath not He brought thee relief."

Thy Works, Not Mine, O Christ

We transition from our Morning Prayer into singing this great hymn that directs our attention to the righteousness of Jesus that is, by faith, counted as our own righteousness. It is an alien righteousness, one that does not originate within us; but is given to us as a gift. And praise be to God that it is not our own "righteousness," for we have no righteousness of our own to offer up to God. This hymn reminds us that our only hope, our standing before God, rests wholly in what Christ has done for us. Stanza one contemplates the faithful and complete obedience of Jesus in fulfilling all the law's demands—what theologians call the active obedience of Christ. Stanzas two and three consider the sacrifice of Jesus upon the cross of Calvary, where He made full atonement for the sins of His people—what theologians call the passive obedience of Christ. And it is both the active and passive obedience of Jesus Christ that is our righteousness. In His death, He paid the debt of our sins. With His obedience to the law, He fulfilled what we could never, in our own strength, accomplish. And the Christian, clothed in the righteousness of Christ, stands before God without spot or blemish, wearing the works of Christ. Thus each stanza ends with the rhetorical question, "Where else can I go but to Jesus?"

Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee

In response to the Word preached, we seek to stir up within us hearts of praise full of Christ. The author of this famous hymn, Bernard of Clairvaux, was the son of a knight who served the Duke of Burgundy, France. Bernard was educated at Chatillon, where he was distinguished by his studious and meditative habits. He entered the monastery of Citeaux (the first Cistercian institution) in 1113. He rose to eminence in Church politics and gained fame by "preaching the Crusades." He was well known in Rome, and founded 163 monasteries throughout Europe. Bernard, despite his blind spots and flaws, was a man of exceptional piety and spiritual vitality. Martin Luther, 400 years later, called him, "the best monk that ever lived, whom I admire beyond all the rest put together." He was a favorite of John Calvin, who quoted him often.
