A GUIDE TO THE MORNING SERVICE

The Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs

God Is Known Among His People

Our opening psalm of praise is a majestic setting of Psalm 76 from The Psalter of 1912, which is well known to our congregation. It highlights God's sovereign control over all things. Stanza 3 proclaims that He is both the Great Judge and the executioner of His judgments. It also draws a distinction between God's people (to whom He is known, and with whom He has established His abode), and His enemies, who receive His just displeasure. It is set to the tune of "Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven" ("Lauda Anima").

Rock of Ages, Cleft for Me

This hymn serves as a fitting preparation for the Word read and proclaimed. It is one of the great hymns of the faith, and well loved by this congregation. Each stanza is so rich in gospel truth, explaining the sinner's plight, the Savior's cure, and the means that Christians receive that cure. The hymn paints a stark picture of the sinner: he is doubly enslaved to sin (to both its curse and its power) and incapable of doing anything in his own strength to become free from his bondage (whether by his own labors or by his own sorrow). But the Savior is the Rock of Ages, Whose shed blood provides the "double cure" for the slavery of sin, Who is there to provide spotless garments for the naked, and Who will one day greet His children "in worlds unknown." And how can this be? What must His children do to appropriate this salvation? "Nothing in my hands I bring, simply to thy cross I cling!"

No, Not Despairingly Come I to Thee

As we respond to God's Word to us this morning we are reminded of our great need of a Savior. This hymn adequately expresses our sorrow over the ongoing sin in our lives, sin that the hymn's author, Horatius Bonar, calls "infinite, infinite, sin upon sin." Though the mood of the hymn is somber, there is much hope for the sinner. The closing line of the opening stanza is our comfort: "sin hath gone over me, yet is this still my plea, Jesus hath died." And because we know God to be a faithful God, we come, "not despairingly" to confess our sins, confident that "faithful and just . . . loving and kind art Thou." We serve a God who delights in forgiving our sins. We mourn our sins, we confess our sins, we turn from our sins, and we look to God to remove our sins.
