### A Guide to the Morning Service

#### The Welcome

We welcome all to this service of worship. If you are a Christian visiting with us today, we greet you in the name of our common Lord. If you are not a believer, we greet you as a friend and trust that you will sense the warmth and genuineness of our reception. We also hope that this guide will help you understand the various components of our service, and thus make you more comfortable and familiar with it. By the way, we try to present most of our announcements prior to the service in order to avoid interrupting the flow of our worship of God with distractions that take our minds away from our central purpose: giving to the Lord the glory due His name.

### The Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs

#### All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name!

We open our Lord's Day Morning Worship today by singing this well-known and majestic hymn. This is a much-loved hymn of our congregation, as indeed it is throughout the world. It has been called "The National Anthem of Christendom," and has been translated into almost every language where there are Christians. The author of the hymn, Edward Perronet, was the descendent of a French Huguenot family who fled first to Switzerland and then to England to escape religious persecution. Perronet was a pastor who worked closely with the brothers, John and Charles Wesley, for many years in England's 18th century revival. The first stanza appeared anonymously in *The Gospel Magazine*, November 1779. In April 1780, the same magazine published eight verses titled, "On the Resurrection, the Lord is King." It resurfaced half a dozen years later, again anonymously, accompanied by an acrostic poem whose letters spelled out the author's name: "Edward Perronet." A fitting way to begin our congregational singing this morning, we sing it to the alternate, beautiful, and flowing tune "Diadem."

#### Doxology

In response to our Morning Scripture reading, we sing this doxological text from the hymn, "Sing Praise to the Lord." This lovely hymn is actually a paraphrase of Psalm 150, the conclusion to the book of Psalms, which exhorts, "Praise the LORD. Praise God in His sanctuary; praise Him in His mighty heavens!" Indeed, as the hymn exclaims, "for love in creation, for heaven restored, for grace of salvation," let us sing praise to our Lord!

#### The Mighty God, the Lord

The text of this psalm is based on the Scottish *Psalter of 1650*. It speaks of the awesome sovereignty and judgment of God. Though these words may be new to us, the tune "Diademata" is one of our favorites (we use it to sing "Crown Him with Many Crowns"). The words are a paraphrase of the first six verses of Psalm 50, and they speak of the Lord coming down from heaven to judge the righteous and the wicked. It is a courtroom scene of sorts, as God calls forth the creation to be a witness to His just judgments. Truly, when God speaks, all creation listens.

#### A Debtor to Mercy Alone

The gospel is a humbling message, and this hymn by Augustus Toplady (author of "Rock of Ages") accurately portrays the Christian's total dependence upon the mercy of God for His eternal security. In stanza one, Toplady notes how our security is anchored in the covenant promises of God and the righteousness of Jesus Christ, which has been imputed to all who truly believe. Stanza two reminds us of God's love for us and borrowing the language of Romans 8, assures us that nothing above or below can separate us from that love. Stanza three points us to our safe and secure position—resting in the palm of God's hand—and proclaims that those who already enjoy the benefits of heaven may be more happy at present, but their our destinies are no less secure than theirs. This is a beautiful hymn by which to respond to our study of God's Word and to conclude our corporate worship this Lord's Day morning.
