THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God the Father, Almighty, Maker of Heaven and Earth:

And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell; the third day he arose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

This brief affirmation of basic Christian belief is called the Apostles' Creed, not because one or several of the Apostles of the New Testament were its author, but because it expresses the faith the Apostles taught. So, it is "Apostolic" in the sense that it affirms and preserves the faith which they learned from Jesus. You will notice that we use the traditional translation of the Creed which retains both a beauty of language and some unfamiliar words: "Ghost" is employed where we would use "Spirit," the word "quick" where we would use "living," and "catholic" where we would use "universal." Also, when we say that Christ "descended into hell," we are not saying that upon His death, Jesus actually went into hell; instead, we are affirming that Jesus suffered all the pains and torments of hell as He endured the unmitigated wrath of God.

DEPRESSION SEMINAR SERIES

"Depression: What It Is and How We Deal with It"

A four-week luncheon seminar series is scheduled for September 23, 30, October 7, and 14, 12 noon-12:45 p.m. Lunch is provided for \$6. The four sessions will be centered around understanding the causes of depression, recognizing some of its warning signs, encouraging those who may struggle with depression, and particular emphasis on adolescents and depression. Our speakers will be Dr. John Cox and Dr. David Elkin. The schedule will be as follows:

September 23: Dr. John Cox "Why do Good Christians Sometimes get Depressed?"

September 30: Dr. John Cox "How Good Christians get Undepressed (and how we help?)"

October 7: Dr. David Elkin Adolescents and depression.

October 14: Dr. Cox and Dr. Elkin Question and Answer session.

A GUIDE TO THE MORNING SERVICE

An often quoted verse from Scripture in which Jesus encourages giving reads: "give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you." But this verse is introduced by another well-known verse, "Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven (Luke 6:37)." Jesus is not ruling out church discipline or discernment, but rather commands us to discontinue the eagerness to see fault in others. And He reinstates that with two positive commands: forgive (change of attitude) and give (the evidence of the change). In other words, instead of seeking the ill-welfare of others in criticizing, we are to seek the welfare of others. This week we will explore the meaning of and the place for Offertory during our gathered worship.

The Presentation of God's Tithes and Our Offerings

What are tithes and offerings? Tithing is an Old Testament concept that perhaps finds its initial practice in the life of Jacob; much before the giving of the Law. When Jacob was fleeing from his brother, he dreamed a dream at Bethel. In that dream, God promised Jacob saying, "Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land. For I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you" (Genesis 28:15). In response, when Jacob awoke from his sleep, Jacob vowed to God saying, "... of all that you give me I will give a full tenth to you" (Genesis 28:21). Jacob's giving was his response to God's promise to keep His covenant promises toward Jacob. The New Testament, however, does not designate a particular portion of income, but rather encourages us to give in keeping with our income: "On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper"(1 Corinthian 16:2). Even so, giving a tenth portion can be a good formula for our giving.

Why is it a part of corporate worship? Acts 2:42 says, "And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42). The word "fellowship" can likewise be translated as "sharing of material goods." In other words, the worship service of the early church constituted the ordinary means of grace (the Word, the prayer, and the sacraments) and the practice of giving. This is the reason why giving is a part of public worship at First Presbyterian Church: so that we might continue to be useful in the work and worship of the Lord at First Church, in charitable giving and in missionary works.

How must we give? If Jacob could give joyfully to a God whom he had known only through the partial revelation of the Old Testament, how much more should we give joyfully to God who has disclosed Himself to us fully in the face of Jesus Christ! Our offering, therefore, is not simply about giving money, but rather giving ourselves. The act of offering our money should be a demonstration of a deeper reality: because God has brought us from death to life in the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we are to joyfully give ourselves as living sacrifices unto God (Romans 6:13, 12:1) and provoke one another to love and good deeds (Hebrews 10:24). Therefore, may each of us "give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7)."
