Zephaniah

Key Thought: Day of the Lord

Key Verse: 1:14

<u>Author:</u> Zephaniah identifies himself with the royal house, being a great-great grandson of Hezekiah.

<u>Time:</u> About 625 BC, a contemporary of Jeremiah (at least during portion of his ministry). Israel carried captive and Judah still living indifferent to God.

<u>Object:</u> To warn of coming judgment and to comfort the hearts of the godly remnant who had not denied God. Zephaniah is a summary of what the other prophets have been saying.

- I. <u>Chapters 1-2:3 The general truths about the Day of the Lord directed particularly</u> against Jerusalem
 - 1. Verses 2-6 Solemn warning of Jehovah's judgment
 - a. Verse 6 "Them that are turned back from the Lord and those that have not sought the Lord, nor inquired for Him."
 - 2. Verses 7-18 More detailed account of how awful threatenings would be carried out (Notice especially verses 7, 10, 11, 12, and 18).
 - 3. Chapter 2 verses 1-3 A call to the remnant to seek the Lord
- II. Chapter 2:4-3:7 Warnings and admonitions to the nations
 - 1. Here again as in so many other prophets we have foretold divine judgment upon the nations.
 - 2. Chapter 3 verses 1-7 Here is description of moral state of Jerusalem in the prophets time.
 - a. Notice condition of princes, judges, prophets and priests
 - b. Verses 6, 7 God says He punished nations hoping Judah would repent, "but they rose early and corrupted all their doings."
- III. Chapter 3:8-20 Encouragement and promise of salvation to those who repent
 - 1. Verses 8-13 God will pour out His judgment
 - a. Verse 12 a remnant shall be left
 - 2. Verses 14-20 The godly remnant shall enjoy the favor of Jehovah

Three Lessons on "Day of the Lord" (Suggested by Dr. G. Campbell Morgan)

I. Content of the Day of the Lord

- 1. Chapter 1, verses 2 and 12 God will visit this earth in sudden, swift and irrevocable judgment. Refer to 2 Peter 3:10, 11.
- 2. Chapter 1, verse 14 Not as in other days, but with supernatural judgment.

II. Extent of the Day of the Lord

- 1. Chapter 1, verse 12 Judgment will be discriminative
 - a. Chapter 3, verses 1 and 2 Judgment upon luxury and indifference
- 2. Chapter 3:3ff results

III. <u>Intent of the Day of the Lord</u>

- 1. Chapter 3:14ff The enthronement of the Lord
- 2. There will be a new order
