### **GUIDE TO THE MORNING SERVICE**

### THE NICENE CREED

The Nicene Creed was first written in 325, building upon the Apostles' Creed, in response to the needs of the church of the time. There were those who rejected the clear teaching of Jesus's divinity. Therefore, the creed emphasizes the divinity of Christ. He is affirmed to exist before all worlds. He is not a creature, having been made, but he is begotten, being of the one and same substance as the Father. He is not, as some said, of a "similar substance," meaning he is like God; rather, Jesus is of the same substance, meaning he is God. Jesus is pre-existent and equal with God. It is by Christ that all things have been made.

Then, in 381, the creed was revised largely to highlight the divinity of the Holy Spirit. Finally, in the 6th century, a final clause "and the son" was added, to emphasize that the Holy Spirit proceeds not only from the Father but also from the Son. This creed clearly shows the closeness, the glory, and the equality of our triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
