Two Cities, Same Gospel Brock Family Takes Ministry to Scotland



Across the Atlantic Ocean lies a lovely city with a lovely church where God's people gather for worship. And soon our Minister of Young Adults, Cory Brock, will minister there at St Columba's Free Church of Scotland in Edinburgh. The congregation there has many young families living and working in a bustling city in need of gospel teaching. Cory will join Derek Lamont at this church whose building is in the city-centre, on the Royal Mile, next to Edinburgh Castle in the capital of Scotland.

Cory and Heather Brock and their family have served at FPCJ for the last three and a half years, and he has been in ministry for eleven years, with four of those serving as an intern at FPCJ from 2009-13. Prior to serving as a minister at FPCJ, Cory was a doctoral student at University of Edinburgh and worshipped at St. Columba's where he also served as ministry director and as an out of bounds pastor from our Presbytery. First Presbyterian

Church is commissioning the Brock family into the mission field once again to serve in the Free Church of Scotland with a partnership and pledge of support from FPCJ.


On Sunday, October 31, the church commissioned the Brock family to proclaim Christ. David Strain charged Cory to preach Christ as the theme of every sermon—warning people of wrath to come and teaching of Christ crucified for all of us. All people need Jesus both here and abroad. Dr. Strain reminded Cory that ministry is hard and that he does not go in his own strength but is to rest in Jesus and cling to Christ.

The connections between First Presbyterian Church Jackson and St. Columba's are very deep. FPCJ is a Scottish Presbyterian Church by tradition. Edinburgh is the historic center of Scottish Presbyterianism and where the Scottish Reformation started under John Knox. St. Columba's is the General Assembly seat of the Free Church of Scotland and now stands in a very different culture, one in which there are few Christians. Our Scottish pastor, David Strain, and his family worshipped at St. Columba's while they were in Edinburgh and countless others have been a part of the congregation at St. Columba's, while visiting, or while students at the seminary and divinity schools just across the street.

Cory says that they are drawn to St. Columba's both because of their past relationships there and also because the church issued a call for them to come. There are real, significant needs for the Scottish church in the midst of a thoroughly secular humanist culture, and the Brocks feel like God has called them to answer yes to the church's call.

The FPCJ ministry staff hopes to explore and build a long-term ministry partnership with St. Columba's in which the two congregations support and encourage one another. As specific needs are identified, the congregations from both churches look forward to growing closer as believers in our different cities with the same gospel and the same Lord, praying for one another, and seeking a movement of the gospel in both Jackson and Edinburgh.



The unfortunate reality is that most orphans will never be adopted. Of the estimated 140,000,000 orphaned children in the world, over 99% are not adopted, and some of these children become targets for abuse and sexual exploitation. Many more reach adulthood totally unprepared and without the knowledge that they have a Heavenly Father who loves them dearly.

Lifeline Children's Services created the (un)adopted program in 2009 with a goal of reaching these children with the gospel. (un)adopted strives to develop a model of ministry that can be replicated throughout the world. The ministry works with the indigenous international church to care for the physical and spiritual needs of orphans while giving them necessary job and life skill training, and it also exposes American churches, businesses, and individuals to the plight of orphans around the world.

The offering collected in children's Sunday School classes in November and December will be designated for Lifeline Children's Services to support their (un)adopted program. Please consider how your family can support this ministry through prayer and giving.
